However, in late February we were happy to welcome the first small group of mission volunteers in nearly two years.


It is my hope that continued low incidence of COVID-19 will enable us to open these programs in the near future and to soon be able to resume regular worship in the 95-yr-old mission church.

## Bobcat Sighting!

Last Fall, one of our benefactors contacted me to ask what “big ticket” need the mission might have. The first thing that came to mind was a tractor. Those who have visited us know that weather and road conditions are sometimes harsh at the mission. A tractor could be useful for snow removal, conditioning the dirt surfaces around the mission, and other needs within the community.

He agreed and, after several weeks of research, we ordered a Bobcat 2450 compact tractor through a Flagstaff dealer. Supply chain issues delayed the delivery for several months, but in early March we finally took delivery of our new “tough animal”.

The tractor has already been used to dig several post holes for one of our neighbors, to move some dirt to combat long-standing erosion issues around the foundation of the mission

house, and to load some sand for another parishioner. We are currently looking for an appropriate aluminum trailer (new or used) that can be used to transport the tractor (built for function, not for speed) to worksites where it might benefit members of our community. Plans are also underway to construct a tractor “barn” for *Náshdóítbái* (Navajo for bobcat) this summer.



## Volunteers

For many years, hosting groups of student (and older) volunteers has been a staple of St. Anne Mission. While the COVID pandemic required a pause, we are happy to once again welcome volunteers to the Mission.

Our inaugural group was a new one: six students and two staff members from Los Angeles’ Loyola Marymount University joined us at the beginning of Lent. A couple of weeks later we welcomed a group of 11 from St. Louis University and for Easter week, we hosted a small group of young men from St. Stanislaus College - a high school from Bay St.

Louis, Mississippi that has a long tradition of sending volunteers to Klagetoh.
